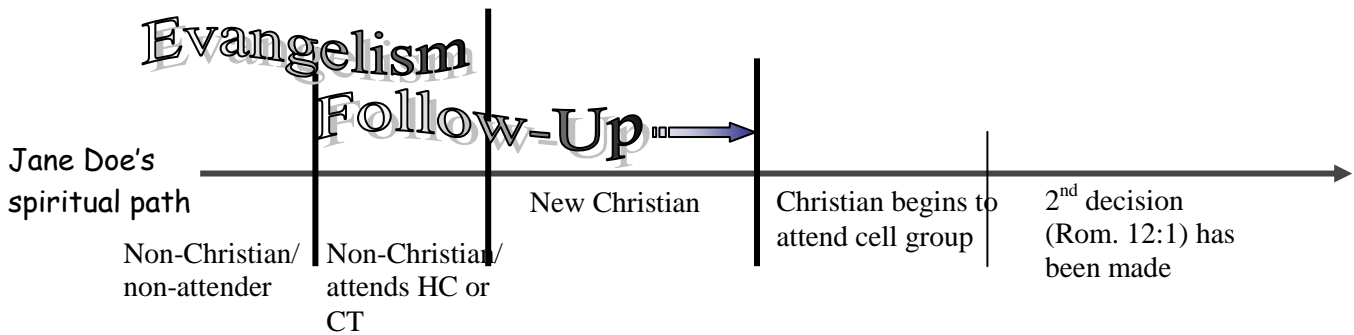
Contrast "Day Care" vs. "Healthy Family":

Definition of Follow-up

The process of on-going personal investment and communication of biblical truth that should occur after a new person has begun to attend home church or Central Teaching.

The goal of the Christian worker in this situation is to make available the truths of Christianity in a way that is understandable, and that is suited to the progress of the investigator. (2 Cor. 5:11; Jn. 21:15-17; Acts 2:44-47; Acts 5:42)

6 Principles of effective Follow-up

1. Each new person that comes to a home church or Central Teaching should be engaged.
2. The workers in the group should communicate and cooperate with one another.

Leaders should take the initiative to *facilitate* each new person being followed up.

Leaders should ask a point person to agree to follow-up the person.

Most often this is the Christian who invited the guest.

The leaders should be clear on what the worker is agreeing to:

THIS IS A SACRED TRUST. THIS IS A STEWARDSHIP FROM GOD.

Practical Goals of Follow-up

- Encourage regular attendance at meetings.
- Once they are saved, acquaint them with the Means of Growth.
- Help them anticipate and counter dissonance. (Acts 14:22)
- Encourage their investment into others.
- Cultivate interest in cell group.
